Biological Resilience for Indigenous Systems Empowerment (BioRISE) Postbaccalaureate Program for Native Americans

A program to bridge undergraduate education to graduate degrees and careers in STEM



The BioRISE program will give recent college graduates of any major the opportunity to use Two-Eyed Seeing to interweave indigenous knowledge and western science approaches to build tribal capacity to understand resiliency of cultural and biological systems and manage natural resources.

Specific skills training includes:

- Research methods
- Ethical conduct in research
- Biological systems thinking
- Data acquisition, management, analysis
- Writing & oral communication
- Networking & relationship building
- Preparation for diverse career pathways and graduate programs

The BioRISE Postbaccalaureate Program is directed through a partnership among the Coeur d'Alene Tribe (Schitsu'umsh), Nez Perce Tribe (Nimiipuu), the University of Idaho and Washington State University. It is funded by a grant from the National Science Foundation's Research and Mentoring for Postbaccalaureate Program (RaMP).
